Summer Reading for All Ages

Children and adults of all ages are invited to see the world and become global citizens this summer by participating in our summer reading programs. There are many ways to participate and lots of great programming for all ages during June and July.

Wee Readers

Parents and guardians of children under 2 are encouraged to register for *Wee Readers*. Participants complete 14 activities with their child to receive fun prizes and a board book. Participants who complete the program will be entered into the prize drawing for a basket of goodies for the whole family.

One World Many Stories: Ages 2-12

Children ages 2-12 can register for *One World Many Stories* and pick up a reading log. Participants

are required to read either 12 picture books, 6 chapter books, or a combination of both. Participants who complete the program will receive a Summer Reading Prize package that includes a reusable library browsing bag, a coupon package to attractions around Kentucky, and more. Participants will also be entered into the *One World Many Stories* prize drawings.

You Are Here: Teen Summer Reading

Teens can participate in *You Are Here* by picking up a reading log. To complete the program teens are required to read for six hours. Teens can read anything they want including books, comics, graphic novels, magazines, and webzines. They are also allowed to listen to audio books. Teens who complete the program can

choose a library browsing bag or a string backpack filled with goodies and will also be entered in the drawing for the Going Global prize basket.

Novel Destinations: Summer Reading for Adults

Adults can participate and experience *Novel Destinations*! Pick up a passport and complete 5 of the 6 destinations. Enter the completed passport into the prize drawing of your choice— one of three gift baskets featuring items from a different country. Complete multiple passports for more chances to win!

Prize drawings for all programs will take place on July 23 during the Family Movie Matinee. All logs, passports and contracts must be turned in by this time. You do not need to be present to win.

Parents as Reading Partners

The importance of reading aloud to children of all ages cannot be stressed enough. Even children who have the ability to read on their own can benefit from reading together. Reading together as a family can instill a love of reading in your child and can allow your child to enjoy more difficult books than they may be

able to read alone. Reading together also encourages reluctant readers and increases family involvement.

This year the library is offering a *Parents as Reading Partners* program to encourage families to spend more time reading together. By signing a reading contract families agree to read







together on a regular basis over the summer. It could be ten minutes every day or an hour a couple of times a week. Your family will set the amount of time. Families who return their contract to the library during the week of July 18—22 will be entered into a drawing for a family fun basket.

Paper Cranes for Peace

The true story of Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes is a touching one. This summer we will be learning about Sadako's story and participate in a project she began in 1955 when hospitalized with leukemia caused by the atom bomb. Inspired by a friend, Sadako began folding 1000 paper origami cranes, a feat that an ancient Japanese story said would grant the maker a wish. Today people around the world are inspired by her story. They continue to make paper cranes that are then sent to Hiroshima to be displayed at the Children's Peace Monument, a statue in the likeness of Sadako with outstretched arms like a crane. At the library this summer we will put into practice what we learn about global citizenship and fold origami paper cranes to be shipped to Japan at the end of Summer Reading. You can fold paper cranes at home using any colored paper squares and bring them to the library or you can use the paper provided throughout the library and fold them there. Instructions for folding paper cranes are available online at <http://monkey.org/~aidan/origami/crane/>. There are also videos on YouTube to help you out. Throughout the summer the cranes will be displayed on the tree in the children's room. They will be shipped to Japan in August to show our support for peace and the people of Japan affected by the recent natural disaster there.
